Dear Friends,

July is a time we celebrate freedom. We hold Barbecues and watch fireworks to celebrate that we live in a nation of freedoms. Freedoms that were hard fought for and won. Freedoms that sometimes need to be fought for again within the nation so that they are provided for all.

The Declaration of Independence, signed 248 years ago proclaimed that all have the rights of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. And in their hearts, the signers believed in that. But we also know that many of the laws of the time only afforded you those rights if you were rich and white and male. The path of increasing what was meant by ALL took many, many years. It took the abolition of slavery and several Constitutional amendments to get closer to the vision laid out in those words. And we know that there are still battles to be fought before it can become a complete reality.

But we love and honor our freedom. We work to make the more perfect union. We heed the words of Scripture to follow the laws of the land that we live in and those that are in authority.

But we are also called to honor and follow the law of God. This may mean – as it did for those that Peter was writing to – that there may be consequences. And followers of God's law need to be willing to face those consequences.

And we also need to be sure that we use our freedom for good and not for evil. Just because something is legal doesn't make it good. And just because something is allowed doesn't mean that it is appropriate for those who carry the name of Christ. Frederick Buechner writes, "We have freedom to the degree that the master whom we obey grants it to us in return for our obedience." We are at our most free when we choose the yolk of Jesus and to submit to his ways.

Enjoy the freedom we celebrate. And practice your freedom wisely so that you may be known as a servant of the one who has set us free.

Glen-Mohawk Seniors


