#### Dear Friends,

I recently read something in a devotional book that made me stop and think. Frederick Buechner, one of my favorite authors, wrote, "We can't see light itself. We can only see what light lights us, like the little circle of night where the candle flickers – a sheen of mahogany, a wineglass, a face leaning toward us out of the shadows."

He goes on to explain that Jesus tells us that he is the light of the world. But we can't see Jesus. We can only see the things that Jesus lights up in the world.

We may sometimes feel like we are in complete darkness, but when we have Jesus with us, we are able to light up a little way up the path and that gives us hope. And when we walk with someone else in faith, we are able to light up a little bit more together. And when we walk with a community of faith, we are able to be the light that we are called to be. The more we align ourselves with other believers, the more light, the more hope, the more promise we can shine in the world.

Those in the world may not see Jesus in our lives or our actions, but they should see what he lights up in the world. And when they ask about what they see, that is our opportunity to share the light with them.

We are in the church season of Epiphany. Epiphany means a revealing, an enlightening. It celebrates the season of Jesus' life in which he enlightened the world by shining his light forth. It also highlights the times where he calls us to shine our light, which is a reflection of his.

Jesus tells his followers, "'You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16)

A t-shirt read, "Be the moon. Reflect the Son." That is the lesson of Epiphany. May we be the light to the world by reflecting the Light of the World, the only true light sent from God.


#### **Glen-Mohawk Seniors**
